Right to Buy - Own your own home

Right to Buy is the scheme that helps eligible tenants buy their own home at a discount. You can now get a maximum of 70% off the price of your home, up to a cash value of £77,900. Each year this amount increases with inflation.

Buying your home is a life-changing decision and you should seek expert impartial advice. The first step is to find out whether you are eligible and can afford it.

The Government offer this service and can give help and support throughout the process, including finding a mortgage, solicitor and surveyor.

Passivhaus Homes

Six new 2x bedroom homes were built in Allotment Road in March this year. The homes are built to Passivhaus standards, which mean that due to the excellent thermal qualities of the design and build, tenants will benefit from very low fuel bills. An Energy Performance Certificate rating of 'B' has been achieved, and research suggests that the annual cost of heating the property could be as low as £30 per year.



Contents insurance

If a fire breaks out in your home, or floodwater pours in, or a break-in occurs, have you considered how you will replace your possessions? Just because such events are rare, you should still take steps to protect your things.

Please be aware that contents insurance is your responsibility. The Council pay for Buildings Insurance but not for your belongings, so, we will not pay if they are damaged or destroyed, unless it is our fault.

By taking out a Home Contents Insurance Policy you would be able to replace your belongings should such an event happen.

Although Fareham Borough Council cannot recommend a particular company, there are a number of locally based companies who would be able to advise on the best option for you. You could also contact the company that you insure your car with as sometimes they offer special rates.

Protecting Yourself from Fraud Scams

Fraudsters are getting more creative in the way they target people with financial scams. The scams are designed to deceive people into handing over their money, credit or debit cards or personal details so the fraudsters can gain access to their money or commit fraud in their name. Some of the major types are:

Telephone Scams (vishing)- This involves the fraudster calling, claiming to be from a bank or building society, utility company or the police and claiming that the victims card is at risk or has been used fraudulently. They then ask the victim to contact their bank/building society and persuade them to transfer money

Anti-Virus Vishing Scam- Here the victim is advised they have malicious software and offer to protect it for a fee. Once installed, the caller gains access to an online account or debit card

Phishing Scam - This involves fake links to websites where fraudsters gain access to card or login details

Here are some points to remember:

- Treat all callers as suspicious until you can be 100% sure they are genuine
- Fraudsters are very skilled in their powers of persuasion
- You cannot win a prize in a competition you have not entered
- Only send money to someone you know and trust
- If it is too good to be true, it probably is.

Recycling and disposing of rubbish

The following information shows what can and cannot be placed into recycling bins.

Yes please! If it's not on the yes list, don't put it in the blue lid recycling bin

 Plastic - bottles only	 Card	 Paper	 Tins, cans and aerosols		
 Household waste	 Cartons	 Glass	 Foil	 Polystyrene	 Any plastic other than bottles

Keep your bin free from maggots!

With warmer weather just around the corner, here is some practical advice about food waste to minimise the chances of maggots. The presence of maggots indicates that flies have been able to lay their eggs directly on food, either in the bin or in the kitchen before it was placed in the bin.

- Cover all waste food where possible
- Double bag all food waste and squeeze air out of the bag before tying and putting in the bin. Wrap smelly food such as fish and dairy products in newspaper before placing in a plastic bag. Make sure the lid of the bin is kept closed
- Keep your food bin clean
- If possible, store you bin in the shade which will slow down decomposition and reduce smells
- Solid waste from nappies should be emptied in the WC before double bagging. Use

of terry nappies will reduce smells in bins

- Use of natural herbs in the bin, such as sprigs of elder, lavender, mint, pennyroyal, rue or southern wood may help reduce flies. Tea-tree oil or citronella rubbed on the lid is an alternative or you could tie mothballs to the handle
- Various powders, sprays and gels have been developed to neutralise smells
- Compost fruit and vegetable waste if possible
- If you do get maggots, use boiling water or cleaning products to kill them.

Get your dog micro chipped

Did you know that it is now a legal requirement for all dogs to be micro-chipped? Owners who do not get their dogs micro-chipped could be fined up to £500.

Micro-chipping costs between £20 - £30 at a vet and involves inserting a sterile chip the size of a grain of rice between a dog's shoulder blades. Once completed, the dog can easily be traced back to its owner should it become lost.

Let's take the Oops out of Poops

Unfortunately dog fouling is a problem in some areas. Not only is it horrible and potentially dangerous, it is also an offence if you do not pick up after your pet and you could be fined £100.

We have recently launched a campaign called 'Let's take the Oops out of Poops' aiming to encourage people to pick up after their dogs. Residents can pick up a week's supply of free dog waste bags from the Civic Offices.

Mrs Paterson's handy hints

Flowers: Cut an inch off the bottom of the stems and place in water within 13 seconds. Adding a little bleach to the water will preserve your flowers longer, because the water is cleaner. Change the water regularly.

Fridges and freezers:

To keep them smelling fresh, sprinkle a few drops of vanilla extract onto a damp cloth and wipe the interior walls and shelves. To dispel odours, place a small container of baking soda inside the fridge.
