Look out for the My Amazing Summe Guide coming out mid – July. This is your go-to guide for lots of fun, free things to do for all the family over the summer holidays.



The Meon river runs to the east of the site and flows through Titchfield.

What will be in the park?

The new park will run along the A27 on Southampton Hill (see map) and will be as big as 15 football pitches. It will have:

Wildflower Meadows | Orchard | Beehives
Natural style play area | Footpaths
Interpretation panels | Dog bins
Educational wildlife areas
Seating | Small car park

Fareham's Sustainable **Housing Project**

Two years ago, Fareham Borough Council opened the doors to six brand-new, energy efficient houses in Sarisbury Green.

The houses were built to Passivhaus Certification Standards – a modern design approach for making energy efficient living space. As well as the bright and airy feel, these homes give tenants the benefit of low energy costs all year round.

Julie Whitecross and her husband were among the first tenants to move in. After being on the Council's housing waiting list

for four years, they were delighted to find their 'forever home', and thrilled with the savings in their bills.

Julie said: "I love the design of the house, it's been thought out very well, so whoever designed it – it's fantastic. Everything's been thought of, it's lovely and light and airy and it's a decent size for a two bedroom.

"The gas bill is fantastic. I'm paying around £5 a week-and that is for heating and water."

The homes were built as part of our aim to provide much needed new housing within the Borough. We're now evaluating the

energy performance of the properties to gain a deeper understanding of the benefits of the Passivhaus design, including the cost of bills, and the positive impact on the environment.

Passivhaus (German) is a voluntary standard for energy efficiency in a building, which reduces the building's ecological footprint. It results in ultralow energy buildings that require little energy for space heating or cooling.











The improvements at Solent Airport coincide with the expansion to the nearby Innovation Centre. This will provide 3,400 square metres of new floor space, 33 new offices, five new workshops and spacious new conference facilities. Look out for news of the official launch this summer!

Solent Airport News

New Hangars

It's been a busy few months at Solent Airport, Daedalus, with things really 'taking off'!

Earlier this year six new hangars were completed (each 6,450 sq ft in size) which are now available for businesses in the aviation, aerospace and marine sectors to rent or buy. These are hot on the heels of five new hangars built at the site last year for general aviation use.

Fill up and go

A new fuel farm has just been installed at the Airport, offering cut price fuel to pilots, who benefit from some of the cheapest fuel prices in the area. This offers both Avgas and Jet A-1 fuel.

Relax and watch the skies

The Airport Control Tower has just been refurbished, which includes a comfortable new corporate lounge for visiting pilots and passengers. There is a tempting café to 'refuel' and an inside and outside viewing area, where visitors can sit and watch the bustle of the airport.

Solent Airport currently has around 30,000 flights per year with a plan to grow in the future. These latest improvements are part of the Council's £50m masterplan for the site which will see it transformed into the premier location for aviation, aerospace engineering and advanced manufacturing businesses in the South – it really is case of the sky's the limit!



Two of Fareham's facilities are celebrating after being presented with top national awards.

Fareham College has been awarded the title of FE College of the Year at the prestigious Times Educational Supplement (TES) magazine awards ceremony. This comes after Ofsted recognised Fareham College as 'outstanding' in a recent visitmaking it one of only four in the country to receive the top grade. The College was praised for being a leading provider of professional and technical qualifications.

Nigel Duncan, Principal of Fareham College, said: "Winning such an award in front of the country's best colleges was an enormous achievement and a testament to the hard





work of our students and dedication of staff. Businesses, parents and students should know that the College of the Year is on their doorstep - so why not pay us a visit."

Meanwhile, Fareham Leisure Centre, which is managed by Everyone Active on the Council's behalf, was named **Local** Authority Gym of the Year at the National Fitness Awards. The Centre was also named as 'outstanding' by Quest, the UK's quality benchmarking scheme for sports and leisure. Fareham is the first centre in the country to attain the outstanding grading in four successive evaluations.

Ryan Grant, Manager of Fareham Leisure Centre, said: "This award and our outstanding mark recognises the fantastic facilities and services we provide, and the work we do alongside the Council to improve the health and wellbeing of Fareham's residents. I am immensely proud of the team for what we have achieved and the difference we are making to people's lives on a daily basis."

These are great news stories for Fareham, helping to put the town on the map with the quality of the facilities on offer. Well done everyone, keep up the good work!
