
## **Volunteering Matters**

**1.** Generations Pre-School; based at Castle Street - Generations is linked with the Adult (older people) Day care centre.

**2.** Portchester Day Nursery - Main nursery for 2 year olds until school age (Based at Portchester School, White Hart Lane

**3.** Portchester Day Nursery - Baby centre for 3 months to 2 years (Based at Portchester School) Volunteers will be asked to assist with tasks based on their own interests and skill sets such as reading, gardening, assisting Early Years staff with drop off and collection of children, lunchtime assistance with hand washing and good food practices, helping put together activities, helping Early Years staff to re-invent rooms and experiences. Volunteers do not need to have experience or qualifications, but are required to follow a safer recruitment process and references and DBS checks will be necessary. Both sites are accessible, and the garden at Generations has been designed to be fully accessible.

Home-Start Hampshire. A voluntary organisation committed to promoting the welfare of families with children aged 0-11 years. **Family Support Volunteers** offer regular support and help to families under



stress either in their own homes or at family groups, helping to prevent family crisis and breakdown, because childhood can't wait. In addition to Family Support Volunteers, Home-Start also relies on the support of the **Community Team** and **Ambassadors**, a group of volunteers committed to raising awareness throughout the communities they serve and fundraising to support the sustainability of the organisation.

The main purposes of the roles include working in the local community to raise awareness of Home-Start Hampshire and its work, raise much needed funds and help to build and strengthen community relations. Also to arrange, attend and give talks to local groups, sharing information about Home-Start Hampshire, and to attend pre-arranged events e.g. recruitment fairs, summer fetes, Christmas fairs and support the Business Development team to identify and apply for local grants and trusts funding opportunities.
