- Highways England
- The Marine Management Organisation
- In a London Borough, the Mayor of London
- Any person to whom the electronic communication code applies, or who owns or controls electronic communications apparatus situated in any part of the area of the LPA.
- Where they exist a Primary Care Trust, licensee under the Electricity Act 1989, Licensee of the Gas Act 1986, sewerage undertaker and water undertaker.
- Voluntary bodies whose activities benefit all or part of the neighbourhood area.
- Bodies representing the interests of different racial, ethnic or national groups in the neighbourhood area.
- Bodies representing the interest of different religious groups in the neighbourhood area.
- Bodies representing the interest of persons carrying on business in the neighbourhood area.
- Bodies representing the interest of disabled persons in the neighbourhood area.
