Restart Grant scheme now available

The Council is delighted to announce that two new 'Restart' grant schemes have been launched to help businesses in the non-essential retail, hospitality, leisure, personal care and accommodation sectors.

These Restart grants will provide local businesses with a one-off sum to enable them to reopen safely as COVID-19 restrictions are lifted.

The grants are being administered by the Council on behalf of the Government and there are different eligibility criteria:

• Restart Grant – RSG-NER

A one-off payment of up to £6,000 is available for business rate payers offering in-person services and whose business is non-essential retail.

• Restart Grant – RSG-HPLC

A one-off payment of up to £18,000 is available for business rate payers offering in-person services and whose business is in hospitality, leisure, accommodation, personal care, gym or sport.

The application process is quick and easy, and the amount paid is based on the rateable value of the property. For more information, or to make an application, please go to <u>www.fareham.gov.uk/grants</u>

Shop Local Shop Safe campaign

The Council is launching a Shop Local Shop Safe campaign with banners and flags in our high streets to encourage people safely back to the town and district centres.

To support the re-opening of high streets, a new website will be available showcasing the shops and services within town and district centres across the Borough showing their opening times and any Covid-19 safety measures.

All businesses in town and district centres should have been contacted to have their information added to the website, but if you are not sure whether your information is included, please contact <u>economicdevelopment@fareham.gov.uk</u>.

The website will go live on 19 April and will be promoted widely by the Council.

Training support for town centre businesses

As part of its plans to safely reopen the high streets, the Council has commissioned Enterprise South to deliver a fully funded programme of support for businesses within the Borough.

The programme is completely free and available to any business within Fareham's town and district centres including Locks Heath, Titchfield, Stubbington, Warsash, Park Gate and Portchester.

The six-week programme of training webinars and one-to-one financial advice is available throughout April and May on a variety of topics to help businesses survive and thrive following the pandemic.

Shaping the Council's Business Support Strategy

Businesses in Fareham are being given a once in a decade opportunity to make their voice heard and influence the Council's future Economic Development Strategy through an online survey.

The Council has teamed up with the University of Portsmouth's Business School to survey Fareham-based business owners and residents living in the Borough who are thinking about starting their own business.

The survey will run until Monday 26 April 2021 and the findings from the survey will be analysed by the Business Resilience and Growth group at the University of Portsmouth's Business School and will be used to inform the Council's business strategy for the next ten years.

- When planning to e-open your business, please refer to the relevant <u>Working</u> <u>Safely guidance</u> for your sector. Guidance in these documents may well have changed since the previous edition, so you may need to update your procedures and risk assessment accordingly.
- You will need to register your business (10 employees and over) to receive free lateral flow tests for employees. The period for registration ends on 12th April please do this as soon as possible. You can find details <u>here</u>.
- Business and premises that have been closed for a long time may be at risk of legionella, for further guidance on what action to take before opening buildings up to staff please follow <u>this link</u>
