COVID-19 Additional Relief Fund (CARF) for businesses

Further funding is available solely for local businesses who have been adversely affected by the pandemic and is aimed for businesses outside the retail, hospitality, and leisure sectors.

The Government's CARF will distribute £1.5 billion to eligible businesses across the country. Fareham has been allocated £2,640,130 of this fund to help support certain ratepayers in the Borough by reducing their 2021-2022 business rates bill by 25%. Where the bill has already been paid, we will be refunding this amount to the business.

Businesses in the retail, hospitality, and leisure sectors, are not eligible for CARF as they have already benefited from significant rates relief. The Council has contacted businesses who may be eligible for CARF and the eligibility criteria for this funding include:

- Businesses must have been in occupation of the rateable premises on 1 April 2021, even if the business has since vacated the premises.
- Where a business has left its premises, the 25% will be applied based on the revised business rate bills for the occupied period.
- Businesses must confirm that they have been adversely impacted by the coronavirus restrictions at their premises either through social distancing, government recommendations to work from home, or reduced demand and have been unable to adequately adapt to that impact.
- Businesses must confirm their Subsidy Allowance/State Aid position.

Please note, we must have a completed application before the relief can be applied. If you think you may be entitled, click <u>here</u> for full eligibility criteria and to apply for the COVID-19 Additional Relief Fund.

(All other the business grants schemes are now closed to new applications, and we will be finalising the last applications that are in the system by the end of March 2022).
