A message from the Executive Leader of Fareham Borough Council, Councillor Seán Woodward

This fantastic new service will offer residents a much more convenient way of disposing of their garden waste, no more bags getting mucky or blowing down the street! It has been a pleasure over the summer to see shoppers returning to our town and village centres, as businesses opened up after the lockdowns. We know the pandemic has been very difficult for the local economy and throughout we have been working to support them. This has been developed in response to feedback from businesses who said that, alongside grants, they wanted help to grow and diversify following the pandemic.

After a summer of cancelled events last year, we were delighted to be able to organise family activities once again during the summer holidays!

Our free pop-up sandpit in Fareham Town Centre proved to be very popular – so much so we decided to extend it for an extra week!

Meanwhile Westbury Manor Museum hosted Family Fun Fridays throughout August, with activities including circus skills, a wildlife display and crazy golf on offer. Hundreds of local children enjoyed these free sessions.

There was also plenty for the older children to enjoy over the summer, with the return of our Access All Areas scheme for 11-16 year olds. Activities included motorbiking, trampolining, sailing and fun pool sessions. We worked with some fantastic organisations to put on these activities, which offered teenagers something fun and exciting to do in a safe environment.

The sandpit and Family Fun Fridays activities were both funded from the European Regional Development Fund. Events like these help to increase footfall to Fareham Town Centre, giving an important boost to local trade.

For a small annual fee, plus the one-off cost of a new brown lid wheelie bin, we will collect your garden waste every two weeks. No more messy garden waste sacks!

How do I sign up for the new service?

To sign up for the new service and order your new brown lid bin, head to

www.fareham.gov.uk/gardenwaste or call **01329 236100**.

How do I pay?

You can pay online or over the phone. Your subscription can be set up as a recurring annual payment.

When does the new service start?

The new service will start from February 2022.

Can I continue using my garden waste sack instead?

The existing garden waste bag collection service will end on your regular collection day between 6–17 December 2021. After this, garden waste sacks and paid-for disposable bags will no longer be collected.

Can I share a bin?

Yes, you can share a bin with a neighbour if you wish to share the cost, however the service will need to be registered under just one person.

Your waste isn't wasted!

Garden waste is taken away to be composted into soil conditioner called Pro-Grow.

Bags of this can be ordered online.

If you would like to make your own compost at home using waste such as peelings, uncooked vegetables, tea bags, straw and pet bedding, a composter will make a useful addition to your garden.

Fully-funded training and voucher scheme for advice

We know the last 18 months have been tough for our local businesses. Throughout the pandemic the Council has worked to support businesses, whether this be through Covid-19 grants, help with introducing hygiene measures or work to attract visitors back to the Town Centre.

Feedback from local businesses has told us in addition to this, they wanted help to grow and diversify following the pandemic. That's why we have established a new framework of training providers to offer free support to Fareham businesses.

Our innovative 'Wider Business Support Scheme' offers businesses access to fully-funded training on topics such as:

- · General business advice
- Advice on business growth, scaling up and diversification
- Digital support
- Support for high street businesses
- Support for the key sectors of marine, advanced manufacturing and aviation.

Businesses can take part through a range of learning tools such as webinars, face-to-face events (subject to Covid-19 restrictions) or one-to-one support, either as a one-off or over a period of time.

COMING SOON... EXCITING NEW LEISURE FACILITIES!

A multi-million-pound project to improve the Borough's two leisure centres is well underway, with fantastic new facilities set to be completed this autumn.

At **Fareham Leisure Centre**, where some of the facilities are 40 years old, a £6m investment will bring a large extension to the gym and improvements to the café, changing rooms and reception. These areas will be brought right up to date, making it the perfect place to work out, recharge or relax.

There will be lots of new equipment at the centre for younger residents too, as a brand-new Top Rock climbing wall is being installed, along with a soft play area and indoor splash pad.

At **Holly Hill Leisure Centre**, which marks its fifth anniversary in October 2021, there will be a brand-new steam room and sauna.

FIREWORKS INFAREHAM

During firework season it's easy to get caught up in all the sparkly, whizz-bang fun of it all.

However, fireworks can not only be dangerous if not used correctly and responsibly, but they can also be extremely distressing for vulnerable people and our beloved pets.

Here is our advice for keeping fireworks fun for all.

Stick to organised public displays

Many organisations and community groups hold firework displays to mark occasions and they are a great place to enjoy a good night out. They often raise money for local charities and are well advertised so local people are aware that they are happening and can plan to look after animals and the vulnerable. You are also likely to get a much better display at an organised event filled with 'ooh's' and 'aaah's'.

Only release fireworks on certain dates

If you are having fireworks at your home, stick to recognised celebration dates as your neighbours will be expecting them at these times and can plan ahead. It is against the law to set off fireworks (including sparklers) in the street or other public places between 11pm and 7am, except for on Bonfire Night, when the cut off is midnight and other occasions such as New Year's Eve, Diwali and Chinese New Year, when the cut off is 1am.





✓ Be considerate

Let your neighbours know in advance if you plan to let off fireworks, so they can take in their washing, close windows, keep their pets indoors and, if necessary, make arrangements for vulnerable people that might be afraid. Quieter fireworks are also available.

Keep animals safe

Dogs and cats might be scared of fireworks and should be kept inside with somewhere to hide. Give small animals lots of extra bedding and nesting material to burrow in.

Wild animals, horses and farm animals can also be distressed by the flashes and loud noises. If you live close to horses, make sure you let their owners know if you are having fireworks well in advance. Don't let off fireworks if they are likely to disturb nearby farm animals, wildlife habitats, or roosting bats and birds.

⊘ Keep safe

Ensure you only buy fireworks from licenced retailers. Only category F2 and F3 fireworks can be sold to the general public. Fireworks must be stored in a cool, dry place, out of reach of children and animals, until they are needed. Always read the safety warnings on the box, particularly guidance on how far away people need to stand. If you don't understand the instructions, don't use the firework.

Do not use sky lanterns as you have no control over them once they've been let go. They can kill animals, litter the countryside and start fires.

⊘ Clear up

Once any debris has cooled down, tidy it up and soak it in water. Then put it in a rubbish bag and in the bin. Do not leave firework debris to be found by animals or in public areas where they will need to be cleared away by someone else.

When - Saturday 20 November, 10am -8pm. Lights will be switched on at 5.30pm

Where - West Street, Fareham
