

Winterwarmer

Get FREE energy-efficiency home improvements



We have been awarded funding from the Government's Sustainable Warmth competition, to offer fully-funded energy-efficiency improvements for eligible homes as part of the 'Warmer Homes' programme.

Funding under the Warmer Homes programme is available until March 2023, for the following energy efficiency measures:

Improved insulation


Air Source Heat Pumps

Solar PV panels

If your home is connected to the gas network, funding of up to £10,000 is available. If your home is not on the gas network, funding of up to £25,000 is available.

The Warmer Homes programme is available to owner occupiers and private rental tenants only. If you are a private rental tenant, your landlord will be required to make a financial contribution and give consent for the improvements. If you are a landlord, your tenant will be required to give consent for the improvements and you will be required to make a financial contribution.

Funding availability through the programme is subject to eligibility, technical feasibility and your home's EPC rating.

£25,000

If your home is not connected to the gas network

ARE YOU ELIGIBLE?

You may qualify for the funding if you meet the following criteria:

 Your home has an EPC rating of E, F or G (limited funding is also available for EPC D rated properties).

 You receive a means-tested benefit.

WHAT HAPPENS ONCE YOU APPLY?

Once we receive your application, we will check your eligibility and you will be assigned an installer.

- **1.** Your installer will get in touch to arrange your technical survey.
- **2.** You will receive a 'Quote Pack' from your installer, including a quote and details of the proposed work.
- **3.** The Warmer Homes team will assess the information provided by the installer.
- 4. If approved, the installer will be in touch to arrange your installation date. Your installation date will depend on your installer's availability.
- 5. Once your measure(s) have been installed, your installer will provide a 'Handover Pack' including your warranty information and any other relevant paperwork.
- **6.** The Warmer Homes team will be in touch to ensure you are happy with the service provided.

Work has now commenced on Fareham's exciting new Community Arts and Entertainment venue, Fareham Live!

Following a long delay as a result of the COVID pandemic, the remodelling work has now started at the former Ferneham Hall site, with completion expected in late 2023.

Following a launch in spring 2024, BH Live will be the new operator for the building and will manage the venue on our behalf. BH Live manage 17 venues, leisure centres and attractions across Dorset, Hampshire and London, including Bournemouth International Centre, Portsmouth Pyramids and Fairfield Halls (Croydon). They will deliver an exciting line up of performances and events to suit a range of tastes for the community to enjoy.

Affordable Housing development underway in Fareham

Work is underway on another affordable housing project from Fareham Housing.



Located in the town centre, the development at Queens Road will deliver two three-bedroom homes. These houses will be made available at a Social Rent (the most affordable of affordable homes) and will be occupied by households from Fareham Borough Council's housing register.

Fareham Housing is working with Southampton based Daintree Developments to deliver these projects. The homes have been specifically designed to reflect the character of the area as well as being wheelchair accessible and energy efficient. Features will include solar PV panels and air source heat pumps to provide heating and hot water, supporting the Council's commitment to be carbon neutral across its buildings and services by 2030.

In addition, two nearby Council owned properties at Arundel Drive are being converted to five-bedroom homes with disabled accessible bedrooms and a downstairs wet room.

Larger properties, particularly those which are disabled accessible, rarely become available. These new homes will help to meet the specific needs for some of the larger families on the Council's Housing Register.


As part of our commitment to become Carbon Neutral across all our buildings and services by 2030, Fareham Borough Council is making some significant changes to the way we do things.

We have now published the first annual update of our Climate Change Action Plan.

Back in October 2020 we undertook an extensive programme of work to calculate our baseline Carbon Footprint. Our Climate Change Action Plan was then published in June 2021, focusing predominantly on reducing the Council's operational carbon footprint.

This annual update tries to find ways we can lower the carbon emissions created when we provide services to our customers, as well as how we can help our residents and businesses reduce their carbon emissions

What's more it shows that since our initial carbon footprint calculation in 2020, we have already reduced our carbon emissions by 9%!

Solar Together is Back!

Hampshire County Council has teamed up with iChooser once again this year to re-launch the innovative 'Solar Together' programme, providing cleaner, greener and more sustainable power for Fareham residents.



The programme was very successful, and it is back again for 2022. It offers high-quality solar photovoltaic (PV) panels and battery storage through a group-buying scheme. This brings Fareham households together to get the most competitive prices. The more people that register, the better the deal will be for each household.

Residents can register for free, without obligation, by providing details about their roof, such as its size and orientation.

An 'auction' will then be held, where pre-vetted solar installers will submit bids for the work. Residents who have registered will then be provided with a solution to best suit their roof specifications and associated costs. There is no obligation to continue and installers will only contact those who accept the offer to then survey the property and set an installation date.

Re-wilding Anson Grove

In October 2021, our Countryside Service team applied for funding from Portsmouth Water to help restore a 900 square-metre area of chalk grassland at Anson Grove public open space.

The bid was successful and, working with a local contractor and members of the Fareham Conservation Volunteers, it was possible to clear the site of invasive species and sow a mixture of grasses and wildflower seeds.

Projects such as this make us more resilient to a changing climate, while increasing biodiversity. It also demonstrates how small changes can have a big impact. The results have been fantastic, and the Council is very grateful to Portsmouth Water for agreeing to fund the project.





Step inside the elegant Westbury Manor Museum in the heart of Fareham to discover a wealth of stories about the town's people, heritage and industrial past.

Managed and operated by Hampshire Cultural Trust, Westbury Manor Museum has plenty to see and do for all the family.

You can find out about the Borough's origins as a Stone Age settlement, the infamous workhouse scandal of 1837 and its long traditions of brickmaking and strawberry production. Youngsters can become an amateur archaeologist and even handle real artefacts, use the interactive tablets to find out more about the displays, and have fun with the museum trail quiz with hands-on history playsets.

If you get peckish, there is also a fantastic café within the museum. which is open to all. From brunch to lunch and cream teas, it's the perfect setting for a bite to eat or something to drink. And, while you are enjoying something delicious from the locally sourced menu, you can take a look at the curiosities adorning the café's walls.

Before you leave, why not visit the gift shop for a range of gifts and souvenirs inspired by the museum's collections and exhibitions? From books to jewellery, bags to toys, there is a wide selection of gifts to browse and buy. Proceeds also help to support the work of Hampshire Cultural Trust throughout the county.
