- The A27 The Avenue between Bishopsfield Road and Station Roundabout in Fareham




A27 between Segensworth and St Margaret's Roundabouts (2016/17)

Broadly, the planned improvements aim to:

- Improve the management of traffic on the A27 and improve journey time reliability
- Improve the capacity of the road by providing two traffic lanes in each direction
- Improve the capacity of key junctions, such as the St Margaret's Roundabout and Gudge Heath Lane/Redlands Lane junction
- Improve facilities for pedestrians and cyclists along and across the A27
