A MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE LEADER OF FAREHAM BOROUGH COUNCIL, COUNCILLOR SEÁN WOODWARD

Welcome to the Spring issue of Fareham Today, which contains news of some exciting projects I can update you on.

This year we mark an historic anniversary; D-Day 75. The Normandy landings in June 1944 paved the way for Allied victory on the Western Front. In our Borough, Daedalus played a significant role in the operation with more than 400 air units deploying from the site on the day - the largest number from any UK airfield. I'm delighted to tell you we will be marking this anniversary with a very special two-day family event at Daedalus – see page 4 for more details.

One of our key objectives is to provide more affordable homes to meet the Borough's growing need. A big part of this is will be the creation of Welborne Garden Village, a new community to the north of Fareham. We have now received an updated planning application from the site's developer which has important details about where community facilities such as schools, open space and roads will be (see page 6).

Speaking of community facilities, we have some great examples in this issue (page 7) of local projects which have been given a helping hand with our Community Funding resource. These projects make a big difference to resident's lives and I'm proud that the Council can help turn dreams into reality in these cases.

I have great news for youngsters as we continue our project to improve the Borough's play facilities. Four more of our play areas will soon be upgraded with brand new equipment. Take a look at what they will look like when they're finished on pages 8 and 9.

It's nice to see spring bulbs now emerging around the Borough, many of which were planted by our Fareham in Bloom volunteers, who work hard each year to help keep our open spaces looking so attractive. As part of the In Bloom project we are once again launching our Community Gardening Challenge. Every year we receive some stunning entries from gardening enthusiasts – see the entry form on page 13 if you'd like to get involved.

And finally, don't forget that I always welcome questions, comments or ideas from residents about how we can continue to improve the Borough that we share, so please don't hesitate to get in touch.

D-Day 75
Daedalus

WEEKENDT REMEMBER

In June this year it will be 75 years since the D-Day landings.



To mark this historic anniversary Fareham Borough Council is planning a special family event to last the whole weekend on Saturday 8 June and Sunday 9 June.

Daedalus pilots flew hundreds of dangerous low-level missions, spotting for the biggest guns of the Allied fleet, to provide the information needed to accurately shell the most formidable of the enemy defences faced by ships and troops.

It was vital that the sole operating base for the squadrons dedicated

to the Naval Bombardments remained top secret right up until D-Day itself. If the enemy discovered where they were to operate from, they could have used that knowledge to work out where the impending invasion would be.

The event will take place at Solent Airport, Daedalus. This is a very fitting location to stage the commemorations, as it was the busiest airport in the UK on D-Day, deploying more than 400 units.

Aircraft will be a key feature of the weekend but there will also be fun fair rides, children's activities, market stalls and a performance stage and arena.

Tickets are on sale now and can be purchased from Ferneham Hall (online, by phone or in person) or from the Control **Tower at Solent Airport.**

WELBORNE GARDEN VILLAGE









Creating a new community is a key priority for us as we seek to deliver much needed new homes to keep pace with rising demand.

At the start of the year we received an updated planning application from Buckland Development Ltd for Welborne Garden Village, a new community to the north of Fareham.

Buckland originally submitted an application, which contained plans for up to 6,000 new homes, in 2017. However, there were a number of areas which needed more work before it could be properly considered. The revised application includes a redesigned layout for Junction 10 of the M27, new plans for the local roads and changes to where community facilities, such as schools, open space and the new district centre, will be.

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

Following receipt of the new application we held a public consultation to gain residents' views, with hundreds of people having their say. This feedback has now been passed to our planning team, who will take it into account as they work through the updated proposals. Keep an eye on the Planning pages of our website for updates.

Most of the application is seeking approval for the general principles of development at Welborne e.g. number of houses and land uses. If planning permission is granted Buckland will then need to apply for approval of the remaining details. The only detailed plans that Buckland is seeking permission for are the proposals for a remodelled M27 Junction 10 and works to the A32.

Community Funding SUCCESS!

Each year a range of worthy local projects are allocated money from Fareham Borough Council's Community Funding resource. The funding is specifically set aside to support projects that benefit the community or environment in our Borough.

MAKING A DIFFERENCE

Fareham Men's Shed were awarded funds to pay for metalworking equipment to be added to their workshop. Chris Hodgson, Treasurer at the organisation, said: "We've got quite a few good skilled engineers in the workshop, but this equipment means another skill for our members to learn and get involved in. It completes the workshop."

1st Sarisbury Green Scout Group

were awarded Community Funding to help pay for a brand-new scout hut. Toby King, Group Scout Leader, said: "In our group alone, we will have expanded from about 90 to 150 young people, and then if you add the other organisations it will be well over 200 young people weekin, week-out using the facilities. So, over the lifetime of the Scout Hut, I would have thought tens and thousands of young people will benefit from the activities here."

Another worthy cause was **Warsash Tennis Club**, who received funds
to pay for the resurfacing of their
courts. Helen Rawlins, Treasurer, said:
"We were struggling to replace the

surface, it was becoming slippery and unplayable. With Fareham Borough Council's help, we've managed to get four brand new courts."

Fareham North West Community centre received funds for replacement heating

Funds were given to 'Little Terrors', a new play group which runs from Broadlaw Walk Community Centre

St Mary's Church, Portchester, received funding for a World War Two memorial

OUR PLAY AREAS...



Outdoor play is so important for keeping children fit and healthy and that's why we are improving four more of the Borough's play areas.

New equipment is being installed this year at Portchester Park,
Sweethills Crescent (Sarisbury/
Whiteley), Castle Street
(Portchester) and Eastern Parade
(Fareham). As well as new play equipment, they will get a fresh coat of paint and traditional games will be painted on the ground.

The improvements are part of a £500,000 programme to update 20 of our play areas over the next few years. Before we upgrade each one we ask residents for their views to make sure children get the equipment they want.

features information about all the agencies who play a part in helping those sleeping rough in the Borough. It also explains how people can help – whether that be through donating their time, goods, money or food – and provides contact details for charities who can collect and redistribute items.

Fareham Street Aid's key message is that it is better to give to the charities that support rough sleepers, and have staff specifically trained to help them, rather than giving direct.



The key agencies involved in Fareham Street Aid are Fareham Borough Council, Fareham's Community Safety Partnership, Fareham Housing, Two Saints Hostel, Hampshire Constabulary, One Community and Inclusion Recovery Hampshire. There are also a number of support agencies such as One Community, Hampshire County Council and Acts of Kindness. All those involved share information and work together to help rough sleepers.

The needs of those sleeping rough can be complex, spanning substance misuse issues, mental and physical health concerns to financial and employment difficulties. By working together, all agencies operating under the



Fareham Street Aid umbrella can offer assistance carefully tailored to meet individual needs and issues.

Fareham Borough Council and Gosport Borough Council have funded extra beds at the Two Saints Hostel, at the cost of £40,000, during the winter months. The Council has also secured its car parks overnight after customers said they felt unsafe because of needles and debris left behind by some rough sleepers.

LET'S CLEAR THE

TOGETHER

The air you breathe can have a big impact on your health and wellbeing. That's why we've been working hard to improve Fareham's air quality.



A report by the Government found parts of Fareham (near the Delme roundabout, Gosport Road and the Quay Street roundabout) need particular attention to reduce the amount of Nitrogen Dioxide.

Since then we have launched our 'Let's clear the air' campaign and following a consultation to hear residents' views, we have now identified four measures we'd like to take forward:

 providing better infrastructure and encouraging residents to walk and cycle;

- real time information (RTI) on bus stops encouraging greater use of buses:
- improvements to traffic signals on Market Quay;
- a scheme to encourage Fareham taxis to change from older diesel vehicles to newer cleaner vehicles.

The taxi scheme will be delivered by Fareham Borough Council and the other three measures will be co-ordinated by Hampshire County Council. We are seeking Government funding to carry out this work. In addition to these measures there are steps we can all take to help improve our air quality, such as walking or cycling for those shorter journeys. Together we can make Fareham a healthier place for us all to live, work and pass through.

As well as promotional leaflets and information on this year's initiatives there will be a number of activities to take part in with willow bird feeders, plant your own plug plant and carnival mask making.

The plant doctors will be on hand to help with your gardening problems so you can bring along a plant sample and we will do our best to tell you where you might have gone wrong!

Free seed cards with a carnival colour mix will also be given away for people to sow and grow at home. The event, kindly sponsored by Fareham Shopping Centre, will be held just outside Debenhams.

CARNIVAL MEADOWS

Since we started our Going Wild initiative six years ago there has been increasing interest in growing meadow type flowers. A new site at Jellicoe Drive (Park Gate) is being created with the local community and a new seed mix sown to tie in with this year's carnival theme. BUDGET BLOOMS Thurs 11 April, 1pm

Like the idea of being able to grow a summer border on a budget? For the cost of just a few cups of coffee it is possible to sow and grow a jewel-like summer border using hardy annuals. The workshop at Holy Trinity Church, Fareham, will teach you all you need to know, with preparation, seed choice and sowing techniques.

Community Gardening Challenge

The Community Gardening Challenge has been at the heart of Fareham in Bloom since its early beginnings and gives residents, businesses and allotment gardeners the opportunity to show off their own gardening skills with 21 categories to choose from.

The initiative is very well supported and is one of the largest around with a friendly and fun approach allowing participants to achieve awards from Bronze and Silver to Silver Gilt and Gold. It is not intended to be competitive but recognises individual effort as well as the difference it has made within the community.

Judging will take place between 8-19 July and all participants will receive discounts and promotions at St Margaret's Nursery in Titchfield and be invited to a celebratory gala evening in September at Ferneham Hall.
