Re Titchfield Neighbourhood Plan

I wish to object to this proposed plan, which shows a requirement for 153 houses within the plan boundary but gives no indication of where they might be built. Fareham Borough Council's own local plan states that NO HOUSING should be built in Titchfield since it is within the Meon Gap strategic area.

This Neighbourhood plan has already cost more than £13000 of public money, the majority of which has gone to consultants whose advice on projects like Crossrail and HS2 has been widely criticised. Have these consultants even visited Titchfield? If so, they will have seen that recommending 153 houses in this small village will only result in the loss of green field sites.

Enough money has been wasted: I would not like my Council Tax to be spent on an unnecessary referendum at a time when Local Government is seeking to make financial cuts.

The Neighbourhood Forum should leave concerns in at least four of the chapters in their proposed plan to the Titchfield Village Trust, which has successfully campaigned for fifty years to keep this village such a unique place in which to live.
